



- 1) Conduct an overview of the visual or graphic. What is this **OBJECT**?
- 2) Key in on the **PARTS** of the visual. If it is a graph or map, read all labels and axes and note any elements or details that seem important. If it is a picture, identify parts in the picture, then provide **HISTORICAL CONTEXT** for that picture.
- 3) Read the **TITLE** or **TEXT** (any important words) of the visual so that you are clear on the subject that it is covering.
- 4) Use the information from the first three parts to detect and specify the INTERRELATIONSHIPS that can be seen, INFERENCES that can be made, and INTERPRETATIONS that might be offered. Pay particular attention to how the visual may represent major trends for the region or the time period.
- 5) Draw a **CONCLUSION** about the visual as a whole. Sum it all up in one sentence. What does it mean?
